Student Council

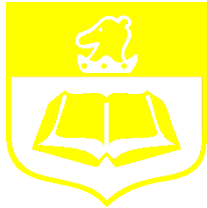

House Captains



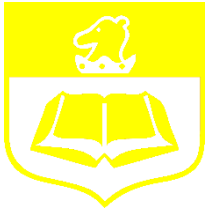
SRPA House Captains are positions of responsibility within the academy. It is important, therefore, to possess the following characteristics:
