SNAPCHAT

REPORT_

TO REPORT A SNAPCHAT OR SNAPCHAT STORY THAT CONTAINS NUDITY OR BULLYING CONTENT

- 1. I need help
- 2. Report a safety concern
- 3. A snap or chat received
- 4. It bullied me / it contains nudity
- 5. REPORTED
- 6. Still need help?
- 7. Snapchat's help centre will direct you to a form where you are able to report the incident in more detail.

SCREENSHOTTING

If you receive an abusive message, it may be a good idea to screenshot it as evidence before it disappears. Snapchat sends a notification to the other person if you do take a screenshot, but remember that you are doing nothing wrong in reporting content that makes you feel upset, uncomfortable or unsafe. However, don't do this if it's a nude image.

Possessing (which includes screenshots) and sending nude images of someone under the age of 18 is Child Exploitative Imagery and is illegal. For more information contact the CEOP (Child Exploitation Online Protection Command).

BLOCK

TO BLOCK SOMEONE ON SNAPCHAT

- 1. Swipe right to go to the Chat screen
- 2. Tap and hold on a friend's name
- 3. Tap 'More'
- 4. Tap 'Block'

Go to your settings and select 'Who Can Contact Me'. Then choose 'My friends'. This will prevent users you don't recognise from contacting you directly with snaps, chats, calls.

INSTAGRAM

REPORT_

TO REPORT AN INSTAGRAM POST THAT FEATURES BULLYING AND/OR NUDE CONTENT_

- Select the three dots in the the top right corner
- 2. Select 'Report'
- 3. Select the reason for the report from the menu
- 4. REPORTED

TO REPORT AN INSTAGRAM DIRECT MESSAGE

- 1. In the top right corner, select 'i'
- 2. Select 'Report'
- 3. Provide the reason(s) for reporting
- 4. REPORTED

PRIVACY_

- Instagram is automatically public but you can easily change your profile settings to private
- Unless added to your story, live streams will disappear once you've finished recording but remember users can still screenshot and record these.
- Naked images are normally a violation of Instagram's community standards.
- Naked images of under 18s are illegal and not allowed under any circumstances.

BLOCK_

TO BLOCK SOMEONE ON INSTAGRAM


- 1. Select the three dots in the top right corner.
- 2. Select 'Block User'

Although blocked users can't access your profile, they can still mention you using '@'. If this happens you can change your username.

WHATSAPP

REPORT/BLOCK_

- 1. Go to the chat with the person/group you wish to report
- 2. Select the group or user name at the top of the screen
- Scroll down on their profile and click 'Report' OR Scroll down on their profile and click 'Block'
- 4. REPORTED/BLOCKED



PRIVACY_

- Remember once someone has been blocked, they may still have saved versions of any
 pictures exchanged on their phone.
- Once an image or video is sent, you lose control of where and with whom the content could be shared.
- If you are faced with explicit images being shared without your consent, contact the C.E.O.P or their programme ThinkuKnow for advice or to make a report.
- Reporting someone may result in them being banned from using Whatsapp.

SCREENSHOTTING

It may be a good idea to screenshot any abusive or harassing messages received in Whatsapp. This can provide evidence should any incidents be escalated to police level. However, don't do this if it's a nude image. Possessing (which includes screenshots) and sending nude images of someone under the age of 18 is Child Exploitative Imagery and is illegal. Contact CEOP if you have any concerns.

TO REPORT A VIDEO, LIVE STREAM OR COMMENT

- On the video, tap the share icon OR Tap and hold the comment
- 2. Tap 'Report'
- 3. Select 'IT'S INAPPROPRIATE'
- 4. Select the reason why you are reporting
- 5. Click 'Report'



Tik Tok is automatically set to public but there are a number of privacy settings you can enable in the app settings. Privacy and Safety features include:

- Allow others to find me
- Private Account
- Who can see my comments
- Who can duet with me
- Who can send me messages
- My Block list

REPORT

TO REPORT A CHAT OR ACCOUNT

- 1. Open the conversation
- 2. Go to the account
- 3. Click on the 3 dots in the corner of the screen
- 4. Click 'REPORT' and select 'IT'S INAPPROPRIATE'
- 5. Select the reason you're making a report
- 6. Press 'REPORT'

FACEBOOK

REPORT_

YOU CAN REPORT PRETTY MUCH ANYTHING ON FACEBOOK WHETHER THIS IS SOMETHING ON YOUR PROFILE, SOMETHING YOU SEE THAT YOU'RE CONCERNED ABOUT OR A MESSAGE YOU'VE RECEIVED.

- 1. Click on the 'Find Support or Report' link
- 2. This appears next to the content/profile that you would like to report
- 3. Select the option that best describes the issue
- 4. When something gets reported to Facebook, they'll review it and remove anything that doesn't follow their Community Standards. Your name and other personal information will be kept completely confidential if they reach out to the person responsible.

BLOCK_

TO BLOCK SOMEONE ON FACEBOOK

- 1. Click the (top right) and choose settings
- 2. Click Blocking on the left side menu
- 3. Find the block users section
- 4. Enter the name of the person and click 'Block'
- 5. BLOCKED

People won't benotified when you block them.
