The wearing of **baseball caps** and '**hoodies**' is not acceptable; these will be confiscated.

Black "trainer type shoes" manufactured by sports companies, e.g. Nike, Adidas, Puma, Lonsdale etc. will not be accepted as school shoes.

The Academy will be the final arbiter on what is deemed to be acceptable as school uniform.

Where a uniform infringement is identified, in order to support students returning to their lessons as soon as possible, parents/carers will be notified. If a confiscation has been necessary, to encourage students to follow the policy, the item will be only be returned at 3.15pm unless there have been repeat confiscations, where it will be returned on Friday (unless collected by a parent/carer). We welcome parental support with this matter to minimise disruption to the Academy with managing students' property. The intention being to rectify the infringement and return the student to lessons.

- Naming of student property is important for clear identification if it is misplaced or lost.
- In exceptional circumstances, where students are unable to wear correct school dress, parents are asked to provide a note for the form tutor to consider. In exceptional circumstances, 24 hours grace can be given to obtain the correct uniform. Please contact your child's House team with any queries you may have in this regard.
