Term 1 Value: Respect

Task Say good morning to at least three people	Task Hold the door open at your classroom/in the corridor/exits	Task Attend peer mentoring training with Mrs Palser
Task In no more than 200 words, write down what respect means to you. What does it look like and how should it be demonstrated?	Task Create a poster that we could display to explain how we can show better respect to others and our environment.	Task Choose an important day in the calendar that we should respect as an academy. Explain why we should respect this day as a community.
