#### Flu vaccinations - 9 October 2023

These will be held on site next Monday when we will receive a visit from the School Age Immunisation Service. This is for Years 7–11 whose parents/careers have given consent.

### PD Day - 10 October 2023

On Tuesday 10 October, we are excited to share it is our first Personal Development Day. For our Year 7 parents, there are six of these each year, where all regular timetabled lessons are dropped down. We explore a variety of areas that support our students in wider learning, supporting their own development inside and outside of the classroom. We have a broad range of activities that allow us to focus on key themes and topics.

This term, the day falls on World Mental Health Day, and in our personal development curriculum, all lessons have a focus on health and wellbeing, with a large part of the day dedicated to this with various foci, such as, positive mental health and keeping safe. We have arranged some enrichment time too, reinforcing to students that a healthy work-life balance is crucial in having a happy life. We will have a variety of sessions for students to try, including art for relaxation, various forms of physical exercise, understanding skin care, tabletop games, debating and Duke of Edinburgh skills and camping taster sessions.

All year groups will have sessions on Learning 2 Learn (L2L), our in-house programme to support students to appreciate what good habits and characteristics an expert learner has and understand themselves as a learner, reflecting on how to improve their behaviours for learning. We will be exploring British Values with our students and why these are so important to us, along with sessions celebrating the European Day of Languages, developing their passion for languages further. There will also be sessions exploring careers, with a different focus for the respective years, dependent on their key stage, with KS4 students looking at the options they have for their next steps, including our very own RP6<sup>th</sup>.

Our Key Stage 5 students will be involved in a variety of activities too. Year 13 are going to Nottingham University to explore their next steps, whilst Year 12 will remain on site and will be working on their 'independent living skills', with some domestic and culinary skills activities, along with some financial awareness sessions.

We look forward to hearing your feedback and hope all of our students have a great day!

## **Combined Learning Centre**

Mr Ward and I have been working on an alternative system for lesson cover at the Academy. In short, supply teachers cost significant amounts of money and do not always manage standards as we would expect to as they are not our staff.

Mr Pepper is leading our CLC strategy and staffs this operationally to great effect. We are trialling this in the main hall after assemblies have finished each day and, after seeing it at work and quality assuring the provision, it is proving successful.
