Personal Development Day – 5 December 2023

On Tuesday 5 December, we have our second instalment of our Personal Development Day plan for the year.

This day has a real focus on next steps, with Year 9 opting into taster sessions for the subjects they may want to choose in Year 10, whilst our Year 11 students are finalising their next steps with work on applications, CVs and with a large proportion taking part in taster sessions for RP6th following their applications earlier this term. Our Year 12 are out of the county, visiting Loughborough University, investigating what a university pathway can offer them. Year 13 will also be focussing on their final arrangements for post-18, with time to finalise their personal statements and focus on their plans for next year, including mock interviews led by the senior leadership team and our HR department.

Our Year 9 cohort will have a full afternoon of sex and relationships education, with a focus on contraception. There are also sessions for several year groups focussing on our Learning 2 Learn (L2L) programme and a focus on British values, covering what first past the post means in addition to how to become a member of parliament.

All year groups will also have a musical performance from a band called ABSNT Mind (flyer attached), who will be sharing messages regarding health and wellbeing and healthy relationships.

SRPA: Our Origins

This year, as part of our continued focus on developing students' Cultural Capital, we are looking to you – our parents and carers – to help us once again, just as you did last year in our very special Jubilee year.
