Lincoln City A4A Scheme

We are delighted to announce that SRPA are part of Lincoln City's new Attendance 4 Attendance scheme. The scheme intends to improve attendance to school in line with the government initiative to raise attendance nationally.

Lincoln City are offering 25 free tickets to a home game at the end of each term to recognise attendance. Students who receive this are required to be accompanied by an adult, who can purchase a heavily discounted ticket at just £10. The top 25 positive behaviour point scorers of those students with 100% attendance this term will be rewarded with a free ticket to the Lincoln v Exeter match on Saturday 17 February 2024.

Lincoln City have also provided SRPA with 4 season tickets. These have been awarded to two Year 11 students as part of their loyalty card scheme, which rewards students for their attendance at revision.
