Personal Development Day Activities – Term 4

Personal Development Day Activities – Term 5

Careers Activities on Personal Development Day 5 – 20 May 2025

Year 7 were investigating the use of creativity in the workplace. Students were extremely creative themselves and produced a range of ideas including logos, workspaces and marketing ideas for their imaginary workplace.

Year 9 demonstrated their enterprising sides when they designed a festival of their choice. Festival themes included music and nature to name but two, and had many wonderful ideas of how to entertain the visitors!

Year 10 focussed on earning money, specifically the idea of paying tax. There were many interesting discussions regarding how the tax system works!

Year 12 were using their culinary skills to compete in a 'fake away challenge'. This involved them designing, making and eating a meal, resembling one which might be purchased from a takeaway style restaurant. In the afternoon, they took part in a workshop 'Talk the Talk', developing their interview skills and confidence with public speaking.

Aspiration Clinics

Aspiration Clinics are small group activities facilitated by Sue Johnson, our Careers Guidance Practitioner. The aim of the sessions is to enable students to explore different careers and find out more about the areas which interest them.



Some comments from Year 7 students about their potential careers:

"I would like to be a farmer because it seems like a peaceful lifestyle where I get to work with animals, plants and harvest crops as well as selling products that I make on the farm."

"I want to be an engineer so I can help people"

"I like cars and Lego, so I want to do something with my hands."

"I want to do Law because I think that everyone deserves justice."

"I want to be a sports coach because I love playing sports and I would love to have a career in what I love most."

"I would like to be a hairdresser because I enjoy doing my friends' hair and trying different styles."

STEM

Our STEM club has been buzzing with excitement this term, as students have taken on the challenge of designing and building Mars bases using everyday materials. Working within strict budgets, our budding engineers and architects have had to think creatively about how to meet all the essential needs of future Mars colonists, from sleeping quarters and food production areas, to recreational spaces that would keep spirits high during long missions. This project has given students hands-on experience in project management, budget planning, sustainable design, and collaborative problem-solving; these are all skills that are highly valued in careers ranging from aerospace engineering and architecture to project management and environmental science. It's been fantastic to see students naturally developing the kind of innovative thinking and practical skills that employers in STEM fields are actively seeking.

We are particularly pleased to announce that the Academy has been awarded the prestigious Gold STEM Club Quality Mark, this term. This nationally recognised accreditation represents the highest standard of STEM education provision. The assessment process showcased our innovative extra-curricular delivery and student achievements. This recognition highlights our students' dedication and the Academy's commitment to providing outstanding opportunities in STEM education.

Spotlight on:

Chartered accountant



As a chartered accountant, you'll give advice, audit accounts and provide trustworthy information about financial records. This might involve financial reporting, taxation, auditing, forensic accounting, corporate finance, business recovery and insolvency, or accounting systems and processes.

Responsibilities

As a chartered accountant, you'll need to:

- Manage financial systems and budgets
- Undertake financial audits (an independent check of an organisation's financial position)
- Provide financial advice
- Liaise with clients (individuals or businesses) and provide financial information and advice
- Review the company's systems and analyse risk
- Perform tests to check financial information and systems
- Advise clients on tax planning (within current legislation to enable them to minimise their tax liability) and tax issues associated with activities such as business acquisitions and mergers
- Maintain accounting records and prepare accounts and management information for small businesses (accountancy)

- Advise clients on business transactions, such as mergers and acquisitions (corporate finance)
- Counsel clients on areas of business improvement, or dealing with insolvency
- Detect and prevent fraud (forensic accounting)
- Manage junior colleagues
- Liaise with internal and external auditors (where applicable) and deal with any financial irregularities as they arise
- Produce reports and recommendations following internal audits or public sector audits
- Prepare financial statements, including monthly and annual accounts
- Arrange financial management reports, including financial planning and forecasting

Salary

Accountant salaries vary depending on the location, sector, size and type of firm, but graduates can expect to start on around £25,000 to £30,000.

During training this may rise to approximately £40,000.

Qualified chartered accountants usually earn up to £65,000, depending on their level of experience.
