Welcome to my end of week update letter. The next few letters up until the festive break will see plenty of important updates as the trips, evening events and activities come thick and fast.

This week, our football teams have been in action in various county and national competitions. Our u14 girls played a great game for the neutral in their county cup, drawing 5-5 AET with Spalding before losing on penalties. The Year 7 footballers beat St George's 4-0 in the county cup, our Year 8 team beat Thomas Middlecott 2-0 in their county cup, while the Year 9 team played Dronfield and won 2-1 in the national cup. The latter result is all the more creditable given the opposition were Derbyshire's county champions.

More updates below:

Personal Development Day 2

All of our students will be participating in their Second Personal Development Day on Wednesday 3 December.

In Year 7, students will be learning about the challenging inappropriate behaviour, exploring the fundamental British Values that uphold our nation, exploring how to resolve conflict between their peers and exploring Unifrog, a fantastic resource that allows students to explore career options through their current interests.

In Year 8, students will be exploring the different strategies for learning they can utilise in their lessons, learning about the impacts of data sharing on their personal lives and undertaking the Enterprise Tyre Challenge – a task that explores the impact of wasted tyres on the environment and methods of utilising them for a better purpose.

In Year 9, students will be exploring the different GCSE options provided by the Academy, understanding the role of the House of Lords in government and assessing the need for communication, emotional wellbeing and boundaries in a romantic relationship.

In Year 10, students will be exploring the aspects of an unhealthy relationship and how to challenge these aspects, as well as undertaking the Enterprise food challenge – a task that explores sustainability and responsible consumption to reduce food waste.

In Year 11, students interested in A-level studies will be undertaking a critical thinking workshop run by the RP6th team. Other students will be utilising this time to update their CVs in preparation for Post-16 pathways. Students will also be exploring different revision strategies and how to effectively utilise them.

All students in KS4 will also be completing a session on fact-checking information and how to approach different sources of information.

Our Year 12 students will be exploring workshops on car maintenance and staying safe at night.

Our Year 13 students will be taking part in a revision workshop hosted by the University of Lincoln, as well as undertaking mock interviews conducted by our SLT in preparation for their further studies.

During the afternoon, each of our KS5 students will be leaving the Academy for an afternoon of stress-busting at Gutterball in the city centre.

Each of our students in Years 7-11 will also be exploring the role of respect in our Academy and how respect is upheld between peers, staff and members of the community.

Year 11 Intervention

Our full programme of intervention has begun for Year 11 in preparation, in the first instance, for the mock examinations in January. Students are not required to sign up to sessions, but should ensure that they arrive at sessions promptly to enable the time to be maximised. If students arrive to sessions late, they may not be accommodated. Attendance at all intervention sessions will be monitored and students will receive entries into a prize draw. After-school sessions will run from 3:20pm until 4:15pm unless otherwise stated and students who usually take the school bus will have to make alternative arrangements for their transport home.
