Therapeutic Radiography
Bursary (UK)

The CoR's access to pre-registration therapeutic radiography education and training support programme was established from a generous legacy and aims to support individuals who would otherwise not be able to access educational opportunities.

£ Value

The bursary pays tuition fees for the course duration for UK residents where recipients are NOT eligible to have their tuition fees paid by the government. Where recipients ARE eligible to have their tuition fees paid by the government, the bursary is worth £6k per year.

Availability

For up to five eligible individuals each year who are seeking to enrol on a programme of undergraduate or postgraduate pre-registration study leading to an honours degree in therapeutic radiography.

Eligibility

The bursary is open to applicants who meet the eligibility criteria.

Programmes

Full-time or part-time courses in the UK approved by the College of Radiographers and the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC).

Graduation

On completion, graduates must be eligible to apply for registration with the HCPC so that they may work in the UK as a therapeutic radiographer.

4 February – MFL Careers Fair at LSST

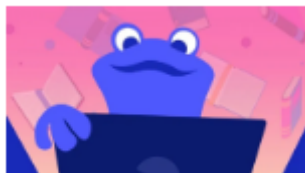

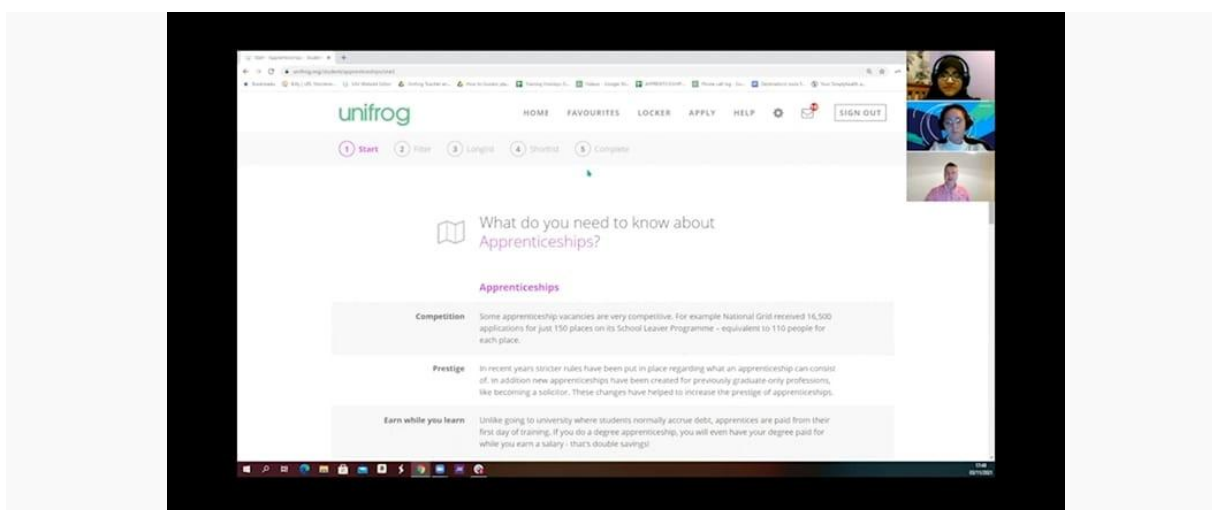

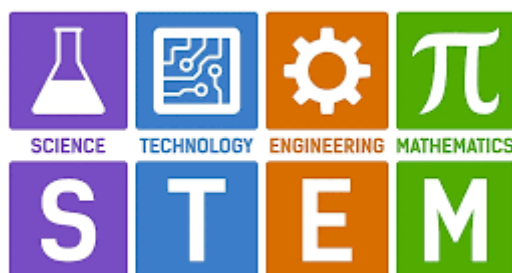

STEM



During Term 3, STEM club focused on science for survival, making compasses from scratch, and learning how to make reflective surfaces and send signals over long distances, even looking cross-curriculum to music and history at the historical use of war horns for signalling!

With spring around the corner for Term 4, STEM club has turned our attention to plants and new growth, looking first at the structure of a leaf under a microscope and moving on to growing our own plants using modern agricultural techniques.

Spotlight on Careers in English



Why English Opens More Doors Than You Think

When people think of English as a subject, they often picture novels, poetry, and essays. But English is far more than that. It's the foundation of communication, creativity, critical thinking, and cultural understanding—skills that employers across every sector value highly. For students, studying English can lead to a wide range of exciting careers both locally and nationally.

Where Can English Take You?

Local Opportunities

Right here in Lincolnshire, strong English skills are in demand across many industries, including:

- **Education** – Teaching assistants, primary and secondary teachers, literacy support roles.
- **Media & Communications** – Local newspapers, radio stations, marketing agencies and social media roles.
- **Public Services** – Roles in the council, libraries, community outreach and youth services.
- **Business & Retail** – Customer service, management, HR and administrative roles all rely on clear communication.
- **Heritage & Tourism** – Museums, visitor centres and cultural organisations value storytelling and public engagement.

National Career Pathways

Across the UK, English can also lead to careers such as:

- **Journalism & Broadcasting** – Reporters, editors, producers, content creators.
- **Publishing** – Editing, copywriting, book design, literary agent roles.
- **Law** – Solicitors, barristers, legal researchers (English is a common pre-law route).
- **Creative Industries** – Screenwriting, advertising, PR, theatre, gaming narrative design.
- **Civil Service & Government** – Policy writing, communications, public affairs.
- **Technology & Digital Roles** – UX writing, digital content strategy, AI communication design.

English is one of the most flexible subjects – its skills transfer into almost any field.

Top Tips for Studying English Successfully

1. Read Widely and Regularly

Explore different genres—novels, articles, speeches, blogs. The more you read, the stronger your vocabulary and understanding become.

2. Talk About What You're Learning

Discuss what you're reading to build your confidence to help you articulate your ideas clearly. Ask yourself what you think about a character, theme or article.

3. Practise Writing Little and Often

Practise short bursts of writing – paragraphs, reflections, summaries – to help develop your fluency. Remember: it doesn't always need to be a full essay.

4. Build Analytical Skills

Look for patterns, interpret meaning and evaluate ideas. These are core English skills. Ask yourself: *Why has the writer done this? What effect does it have on the meaning?*

5. Real-World Examples

Watch films, adverts, speeches, and social media posts, texts all worth thinking about and analysing. English is everywhere. Look for it. Enjoy it!

6. Seek Feedback and Redraft

English rewards improvement. Redrafting your work will help you refine your ideas and strengthen your writing.

English isn't just about passing exams. It's about learning to communicate with confidence, think critically, and understand the world. Whether you dream of working locally or nationally, in a creative field or a technical one, English gives you the tools to succeed.

Virtual Work Experience with Springpod

Are you looking for ways to help your child gain real-world experience from home? Springpod offers a wide range of virtual work experience placements across different industries—from healthcare and engineering to media and finance. These interactive programs give students a taste of what working in their chosen field is really like, all from the comfort of their own home.

Springpod work experience (by Year 10 student Jack R)

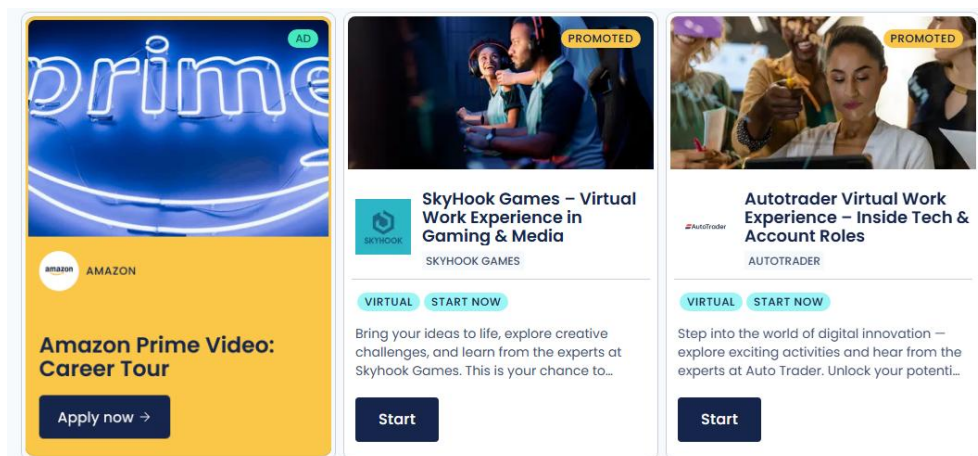
Hello all! I'm here to tell you about Springpod and what I have used it for.

Springpod is an online virtual work experience website; which allows you to do any work experience of your choice in your own time. The only thing holding others back will be the age limits for the work experiences. I did the Avanti West Coast partnership work experience, which I thoroughly enjoyed. In a work experience by Springpod, there will be a certain number of modules which are split into sections. There is informative text to read and, in most modules, there will be 'Springpod sessions', where you get to listen to a select few people who tell you all about their job. They can range from 20-50 minutes in length. At the end of some modules, there is a quick 5 question quiz for you to do just to see what you have learnt. There is an activity for you to do every couple of modules, which will be marked (it isn't marked straight away; it does take a few hours). Once you have completed the work experience (100%), you're able to download a certificate. These work experience sessions also are some fun facts dotted about, so it never gets boring.

Last year over 10,000 students took part in Sutton Trust programmes, gaining the confidence, guidance and knowledge needed to access leading universities, apprenticeships and competitive careers. Applications for 2026 UK Summer Schools are now open.

The Sutton Trust

Summer Schools offer students a free, residential experience of university at one of 13 highly selective universities. Across more than 40 subject areas, students take part in lectures, tutorials and project work while meeting other like-minded learners from across the UK.

Summer schools are open to individuals currently studying in Year 12, have achieved at least five GCSE grades 9-6 and are prioritised if they meet social mobility criteria (e.g. free school meals or care experience).

Personal Guidance Plan for Term 2

Personal Careers Guidance – Supporting Individual Pathways

In Term 4, appointments continue to be arranged for Year 11 and Year 13 students (by request) focusing on post-16 and post-18 options including sixth form, college, apprenticeships and university pathways. All of our students in the medicine/veterinary/dental programme have also met with Mrs Johnson as part of their preparation to pursue these careers.

In addition, we also invite some of our younger students to meet with Mrs Johnson to have a taster aspiration session where they will discuss possible careers.

- Appointment notifications will be sent via email approximately one week in advance.
- Students will meet in small groups to complete the aspiration clinic

These sessions are a valuable opportunity for students to explore their interests, ask questions and receive tailored advice as they plan for the future. Action plans created during the appointment will be uploaded to Unifrog for students to access.
